VINTAGE: 1989

« A mysterious wine, complex and captivating, with outstanding finesse and delicacy »

Denomination :

Vin de Pays de l'Hérault.

Harvest dates: (hand-picked)

8 September – 9 September 1989 (2 days).

Grape varieties:

- 42% Chardonnay.
- 34% Petit Manseng (origin of the vine: Charles Hours – Béarn).
- 14% Viognier (origin of the vine: Georges Bernay – Condrieu).
- 10% rare grape varieties : Muscat Petit grain, Bourboulenc, Marsanne, Roussanne, (France). Neherleschol (Israël).

Climate:

Ideal meteorological conditions: cold winter with north wind and many sunny days; soft, pleasant spring followed by a hot, dry summer with good, regular rainfall. Flowering from end May to 8 June.

Harvest: Apart from one storm, all picking took place in good weather.

Average age of the vines:

6 years.

20 hl/ha.
