VINTAGE: 1999

Denomination :

Vin de Pays de l'Hérault.

Harvest dates: (hand picked)

4 September – 9 September 1999 (6 days).

Grape varieties:

- 34% Viognier (origin of the vine: Georges Vernay – Condrieu).
- 32% Petit Manseng (origin of the vine: Charles Hours – Béarn).
- 11% Chardonnay.
- 16% rare grape varieties : Bourboulenc, Marsanne, Roussanne, Petit Courbu, Muscat Ottonel, Muscat Petit grain, Muscat d'Alexandrie, Gros Manseng, Semillon (France), Neherleschol (Israël), Petite Arvine, Amigne (Suisse), Sercial de Madère (Portugal), Tchilar, Khondorni (Arménie), Albarino (Espagne).

Climate:

Harvest: Every two or three days in August and early September light showers were followed by great heat. A truly tropical climate but no real damage. In the north part of the Hérault, in the Larzac foothills, the weather was ideal, but along the coast there were dreadful damages with hail and violent rainstorms.

16 years.

30 hl/ha.

53.000 bottles and 150 magnums.
